**ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONER
FOR ENTRY OF DEFAULT JUDGMENT**

THE ABOVE-ENTITLED MATTER came before the Insurance Commissioner pursuant to an Application for Default Judgment of the Commissioner filed herein by the above-named Petitioner; and the Insurance Commissioner having examined said Application and the affidavit filed in support thereof, and being duly advised in the premises, does hereby make and enter the following findings and order:

1. This matter was commenced on October 18, 2006, by the filing of a Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause. The Insurance Commissioner reviewed said Petition and issued a Notice and Order to Show Cause, filed herein on October 18, 2006. The Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause were served on the above-named Respondent on October 18, 2006, when said documents were placed in the United States Mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the Respondent at his last known address.

2. The Respondent received the Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause on or before October 20, 2006, as appears from the confirmation of delivery and copy of certified return receipt filed with the Wyoming Insurance Department.

3. The Notice and Order to Show Cause directed the Respondent to file an answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days after October 18, 2006, the effective date of service of the Petition and Notice upon the Respondent. More than twenty (20) days have elapsed since the effective date of service.

4. Since the Respondent has failed to answer or otherwise plead or appear in this matter, the allegations set forth in the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause filed herein on October 18, 2006, shall be and the same are hereby deemed to be true.

5. The facts alleged in the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause, that are deemed to be true, are sufficient to establish grounds for the suspension of the Respondent's insurance agent's license pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-1-107 and Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211.


6. Pursuant to the Wyoming Department of Insurance Rules and Regulations, Chapter 32 §§ 7 and 9, entry of default in this matter is appropriate and such default should therefore be entered.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED as follows:

1. The Default of Respondent James Frederick Besel is entered.
2. The allegations against Respondent as stated in the Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause in this matter are taken as and are assumed to be true and correct.
3. Based upon the allegations contained in the Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause, any insurance producer license held in the name of Respondent is suspended pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211(a)(ii) and (ix).
4. Respondent shall immediately surrender his producer's license to the Wyoming Insurance Commissioner.
5. Respondent shall, from this day forth, refrain from conducting the business of insurance in the State of Wyoming until such time as he shall provide proof that the Colorado suspension of his license has been lifted and reinstated, and an order is issued herein reinstating Respondent's producer license in Wyoming.
