ORDER OF DISPOSITION

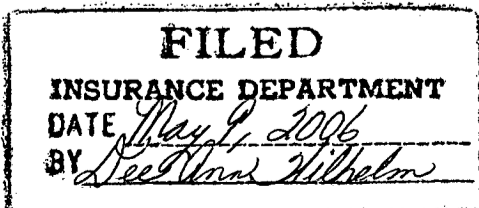
THIS MATTER comes before the Commissioner upon the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause directed to the Petitioner Katherine M. Bughman, 814 East 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, Casper, WY 82601 filed on March 16, 2006. The parties have entered into and filed a Stipulation herein on May 8, 2006.

The Commissioner, having reviewed the Stipulation, together with the file and facts herein, finds as follows:

1. Katherine M. Bughman (hereafter, "Respondent") is and was at all times herein referenced a licensed Resident Producer, holding License No. 44881.
2. The Wyoming Insurance Commissioner has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wyo. Stat. §§ 26-1-103, 26-1-108 and 26-9-211.
3. Respondent was properly served the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause and Notice and Order to Show Cause herein.
4. That the Respondent has admitted the allegations contained in the Petition herein.
5. That Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211(a) provides that the commissioner may place on probation, suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew an insurance producer's license and may levy a civil penalty in accordance with Wyo. Stat. § 26-1-107 for, among other reasons, intentionally misrepresenting the terms of an actual or proposed insurance contract or application for insurance.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$250, payable to the Wyoming State Treasurer.



2. Respondent's Resident License No. 44881 is placed on probation for a period of one (1) year from the date of this order.

3. Respondent shall hereafter comply with all provisions of the Wyoming Insurance Code.

4. Respondent shall remain current in her continuing education requirements.

5. Respondent shall work in the insurance industry **only under supervision of a duly licensed producer** for six (6) months from the date hereof.

6. Should Respondent violate any of the terms of this Order, her license may be immediately suspended without further notice and hearing herein.
