DEFAULT JUDGMENT AND ORDER

THE ABOVE-ENTITLED MATTER came before the Insurance Commissioner pursuant to a Petition for Default Judgment of the Commissioner filed herein by the above-named Petitioner; and the Insurance Commissioner having examined said petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof, and being duly advised in the premises, does hereby make and enter the following findings and order:

1. This matter was commenced on May 3, 2011, by the filing of a Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause. The Insurance Commissioner reviewed said Petition and issued a Notice and Order to Show Cause, filed herein on May 3, 2011. The Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause were served on the above-named Respondent on May 3, 2011, when said documents were placed in the United States Mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the Respondent at her last known address.

2. Respondent failed to pick up the certified mail and it was returned to the Department by the United States Postal Service marked, "Return to Sender, Unclaimed, Unable to Forward."

3. The Notice and Order to Show Cause directed the Respondent to file an answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days after May 3, 2011, the effective date of service of the Petition and Notice upon the Respondent. More than twenty (20) days have elapsed since the effective date of service.

4. Since the Respondent has failed to answer or otherwise plead or appear in this matter, the allegations set forth in the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause filed herein on May 3, 2011, shall be and the same are hereby deemed to be true.

5. The facts alleged in the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause, that are deemed to be true, are sufficient to establish grounds for the revocation of the Respondent's insurance producer license pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-1-107 and Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211.


6. Pursuant to the Wyoming Department of Insurance Rules and Regulations, Chapter 32 §§ 7 and 9, entry of default in this matter is appropriate and such default should therefore be entered.

COMES NOW the Petitioner, acting by and through Stephanie Bryant McGee, Deputy Commissioner, and, pursuant to § 9, Chapter 32, of the Regulations of the Wyoming Insurance Department, herewith applies for the entry of an Order of the Commissioner. In support thereof, Petitioner states and alleges as follows:

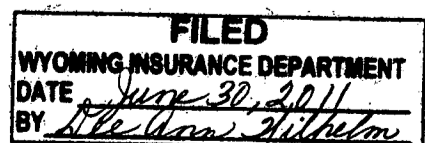
1. This matter was commenced on May 3, 2011, by the filing of a Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause. The Insurance Commissioner reviewed said Petition on May 3, 2011, and issued a Notice and Order to Show Cause. The Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause were served on the above-named Respondent on May 3, 2011, when said documents were placed in the United States Mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the Respondent at her last known address.

2. Respondent failed to pick up the certified mail and it was returned by the United States Post Office marked, "Return to Sender, Unclaimed, Unable to Forward."

3. The Notice and Order to Show Cause directed the Respondent to file an answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days after May 3, 2011, the effective date of service of the Petition and Notice upon the Respondent. More than twenty (20) days have elapsed since the effective date of service and more than twenty (20) days have elapsed since the Petitioner's receipt of the certified mail receipt.

4. Since the Respondent has failed to answer or otherwise plead or appear in this matter, the insurance commissioner may, pursuant to § 9, Chapter 32 of the Regulations of the Wyoming Insurance Department, deem the allegations in the Petition to be true and enter an order accordingly.


5. The facts alleged in the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause, if deemed to be true, are sufficient to establish grounds for the revocation of the Respondent's insurance producer license pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-1-107 and Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211.

**AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF PETITIONER'S
APPLICATION FOR ENTRY OF DEFAULT**

I, Stephanie Bryant McGee, being first duly sworn upon my oath, depose and state as follows:

1. I am the Deputy Commissioner for Petitioner, the Wyoming Insurance Department.

2. Respondent was issued a nonresident producer license by the Wyoming Department of Insurance on January 11, 2010, and such license is subject to the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Insurance.

3. A Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause to revoke Respondent's nonresident producer license for violation of Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211(a) was filed in the above matter on May 3, 2011, alleging the following:

a) Petitioner received notification through the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' regulatory actions summary report notification service of a disciplinary action taken against Shannon Hart in her home state of Indiana.

b) Petitioner's investigation of the matter revealed that Respondent's Indiana producer license has been permanently revoked by the Indiana Commissioner of Insurance on January 6, 2011, for failure to disclose a previous felony conviction and failure to report administrative actions taken against her license in several other states.

c) Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-208(a)(i), a condition for nonresident licensing in Wyoming is that the person is currently licensed as a resident and is in good standing in their home state. Respondent's home state is Indiana.

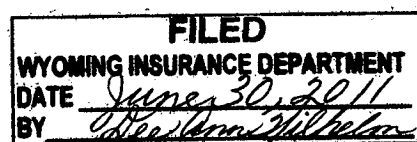
d) Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211(a), the Commissioner may place on probation, suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew an insurance producer's license for, among other reasons:

(ii) Violating any insurance laws, or violating any regulation, subpoena or order of the commissioner or of another state's insurance commissioner;

(vi) Having been convicted of a felony;

(viii) Using fraudulent, coercive or dishonest practices, or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere;

(ix) Having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended or revoked in any other state, province, district or territory;




4. A Notice and Order to Show Cause was issued and duly served upon Respondent on May 3, 2011, by placing a copy of the same in the United States Mail, by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to Respondent at her last address of record with the Department: On or about June 4, 2011, the mailing was delivered back to the Department, marked by the United States Postal Service, "Return to Sender, Unclaimed, Unable to Forward." Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-2-126(c) "mailed notice is deemed to have been served when addressed to the person to be notified at his address last of record with the department and deposited, postage paid, in a mail depository of the United States post office."

5. Respondent failed, neglected or refused to interpose, answer or otherwise plead, and the last day for such answer or pleading has since passed.

6. All of the allegations contained in the Petition and the Notice and Order to Show Cause are true and correct, to the best of my knowledge, information and belief.

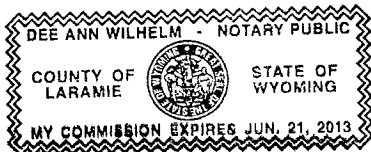


