PETITION FOR NOTICE AND ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

COMES NOW the Wyoming Department of Insurance, acting by and through Stephanie Bryant McGee, Deputy Commissioner, and pursuant to Wyo. Stat. §§ 26-1-103, 26-2-109 and 26-2-111, and Chapter 32 § 4 of the Wyoming Insurance Department Regulations and Rules for Practice and Procedure Before the Department; and the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, Wyo. Stat. § 16-3-101 *et seq.*, herewith moves the Wyoming Insurance Commissioner for the issuance of a Notice and Order to Show Cause directed to Scott William Long, whose last reported address was 200 East Keller Street, No. 12, Lockhaven, PA 17745. As cause for this Petition, the Wyoming Insurance Department states and alleges as follows:

- 1. The Wyoming Insurance Commissioner has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wyo. Stat. §§ 26-1-103, 26-1-108, and 26-9-211.
- 2. Respondent is licensed by the Wyoming Department of Insurance as a Nonresident Producer, License No. 87320 issued October 7, 2005, with a renewal date of January 31, 2008. The Respondent's Individual ID is 74824 and his National Producer ID is 2495951.
- 3. The business records of the Department of Insurance show Respondent is not affiliated with any insurer.
- 4. On or about August 2, 2007, Petitioner received a NAIC State RIRS notification of a disciplinary action taken in the State of Kansas against Respondent Scott W. Long. Pursuant to W.S. § 26-9-214 Petitioner further investigated the matter.
- 5. Petitioner's investigation revealed that several states have taken disciplinary actions against Respondent including a revocation of his license by the Insurance Commissioner of Pennsylvania on the grounds that Respondent was convicted of theft by unlawful taking and for failure to report said conviction to that department. Pennsylvania is Respondent's home



state. A copy of the Consent Order entered into on January 19, 2007, in Docket No. CO06-11-019, before the Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is on file herein.

1. More than 30 days have passed since Respondent's license was revoked in

Pennsylvania and Respondent has failed to notify the Wyoming Insurance Department in

violation of Wyo. Stat. \S 26-9-216.

Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-211(a)(ii) and (ix) the Commissioner may place on

probation, suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew an insurance producer's license for

violating any regulation, subpoena or order of the commissioner or of another state's insurance

commissioner; or having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended or

revoked in any other state, province or territory.

WHEREFORE the Department of Insurance respectfully prays the Wyoming Insurance

Commissioner to:

6.

A. Revoke the Respondent's nonresident producer license for violation of Wyo. Stat.

§ 26-9-211.

B. To enter such other and further relief as may be permitted by law.
