ORDER OF SUSPENSION OF CERTIFICATES OF AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Lumbermens Mutual Casualty Company ("Lumbermens"), 1 Corporate Drive, Suite 200, Lake Zurich, Illinois 60047-8945, holds a Certificate of Authority to transact the business of insurance in the State of Wyoming as a property and casualty insurer; and

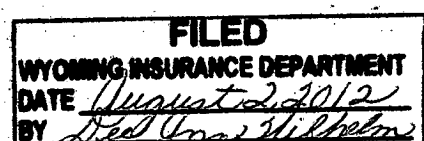
WHEREAS, American Manufacturers Mutual Insurance Company ("American Manufacturers"), 1 Corporate Drive, Suite 200, Lake Zurich, Illinois 60047-8945, holds a Certificate of Authority to transact the business of insurance in the State of Wyoming as a property and casualty insurer; and

WHEREAS, the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, County Department, Chancery Division, entered an Agreed Order of Rehabilitation on July 2, 2012, upon the Verified Complaint for Rehabilitation filed by the People of the State of Illinois, *ex rel.* Andrew Boron, Director of Insurance of the State of Illinois, placing both Lumbermens and American Manufacturers in rehabilitation, copies of which are on file herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-3-116(e), the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Wyoming, without advance notice or hearing, may immediately suspend the certificate of authority of an insurer as to which proceedings for receivership, conservatorship, rehabilitation, or other delinquency proceedings have been commenced in any state by the public insurance supervisory official of that state;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Certificates of Authority of Lumbermens Mutual Casualty Company and American Manufacturers Mutual Insurance Company be and the same hereby are suspended for a period of one year;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-3-118(b), that during the suspension period Lumbermens and American Manufacturers shall not solicit or write any new business in this state but shall file their respective annual statements, pay fees, license fees and




taxes as required under the Wyoming Insurance Code, and may service their business already in force in the State of Wyoming as if the certificates of authority had continued in full force.

PROVIDED that during the suspension period such Certificates of Authority may be reinstated upon Lumbermens and/or American Manufacturers's motion and adequate proof to the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Wyoming that said company has solved the problems which led to the issuance of the Order of Suspension of their Certificates of Authority; and

PROVIDED, however, that if Lumbermens and American Manufacturers fail to request a hearing and prove to the satisfaction of the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Wyoming that they have solved the problems which caused the Order of Suspension of Certificates of Authority, their Certificates of Authority shall terminate at the end of the one-year period and shall become permanently revoked pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-3-118.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Lumbermens and American Manufacturers shall forthwith surrender and deliver their Certificates of Authority to transact the business of insurance in the State of Wyoming to the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Wyoming within ten (10) days after receipt of this Order of Suspension pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 26-3-113(c).
