ORDER OF DISMISSAL

THIS MATTER came before the Wyoming Insurance Commissioner upon the Motion of James S. Mitchell, Staff Attorney for the Wyoming Insurance Department, dated June 29, 2006; and the Commissioner having reviewed the Motion and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, hereby FINDS AND CONCLUDES as follows:

1. That this matter arose from a Petition and Notice and Order to Show Cause served upon the Respondent on May 30, 2006.
2. That the Insurance Commissioner has jurisdiction of this matter under the Wyoming Insurance Code.
3. That the Petition for Notice and Order to Show Cause alleged violations of Wyo. Stat. § 26-9-216(a) relating to nonresident insurance producers reporting administrative actions taken against them in another jurisdiction within 30 days of final disposition of the matter.
4. That each of the counts listed in the Petition for Order to Show Cause in the above-captioned action relate to the individual state filings of the Multi-State Examination Consent Order entered into by the Wyoming Department of Insurance in Docket No. 05-12.
5. That it would be unjust to require the Respondent to notify each and every state of the subsequent filing of the Consent Order in all other states agreeing to accept the Multi-State Examination results.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the above-entitled matter should be and the same hereby is dismissed with prejudice.
