ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

WHEREAS, Western United Life Assurance Company ("Western United") held a certificate of authority to transact the business of insurance in the State of Wyoming in the lines of life and annuities and disability, which was suspended by Order of the Wyoming Insurance Commissioner dated August 21, 2006; said extension being extended for one year from August 21, 2007; and

WHEREAS, WYO. STAT. § 26-3-108(a) provides that a foreign stock insurer authorized to transact life and annuities and disability insurance in the State of Wyoming shall possess and maintain unimpaired basic paid-in capital and surplus in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 capital and \$1,000,000 surplus;

WHEREAS, the grounds for the original Suspension Order was a finding that the company had been placed in rehabilitation in the State of Washington and that the company had not maintained the minimum capital required by WYO. STAT. § 26-3-108(a);

WHEREAS, Western United, now meets the minimum surplus required by WYO. STAT. § 26-3-108(a) and has been released from the Washington state rehabilitation; and therefore, the grounds for the Order of Suspension have been removed.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that the Certificate of Authority of Western United Life Assurance Company in the State of Wyoming be, and the same hereby is, reinstated.
